FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents / Guardians,

Thank you for your active participation during Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) 1. Your engagement and partnership are invaluable as we work together to support our students' growth and success. As we continue this collaborative journey, we look forward to strengthening our home-school partnership to provide the best possible learning experience for our students.

We would also like to take this opportunity to extend our warmest wishes to you and your family for a happy, healthy and prosperous Lunar New Year. As we enter the month of February, I am pleased to share with you some updates as well as upcoming events in the school.

1. UPCOMING EVENTS

1.1 National School Games (NSG)

The National School Games (NSG) is the largest annual inter-school sporting competition in Singapore, organised by schools for schools. This year's NSG Opening Ceremony, held on Tuesday, 27 January 2026, featured vibrant performances, talented student-athletes showcasing their skills, and a strong sense of unity as schools came together to celebrate the spirit of competition.

In collaboration with several schools, Yu Neng Primary School is proud to host the NSG Table Tennis Senior Division Championships this year.

1.2 Start of CCAs and FUNDamentals

CCAs and Fundamentals will commence in Week 5, starting Monday, 2 February 2026. This marks then exciting start for the Primary 3 students on their CCA journey where they have to be prepared and aware of the activities scheduled. For Primary 4 to 6 students, students have to check their involvement in the Semester 1 after-school activities as outlined in the letter sent to parents earlier. We look forward to providing an enriching and enjoyable CCA and Fundamentals experience for the students.

1.3 Active and Healthy Lifestyle

To promote healthy eating habits and an active lifestyle among our students, the school will be organising a Mass Workout on the first Wednesday of every month starting from Wednesday, 3 February 2026. In addition, students are strongly encouraged to bring fruits as a healthy snack every Friday. Through these initiatives, we hope to inculcate positive lifestyle habits and support our students' overall well-being.

1.4 P5 Home-Based Learning (HBL) Day

The Primary 5 HBL Day will be held on Wednesday, 11 February 2026. All Primary 5 students will not report to school and are expected to remain at home to participate in planned online and offline learning activities. 1.5 Commemoration of Total Defence Day

The theme for Total Defence 2026 is "Together We Keep Singapore Strong." Students will learn about the six pillars of defence during their CCE (FTGP) lessons, and how Singapore remains prepared for crises and disruptions.

As part of the commemoration, the school will conduct a Power Disruption Exercise on Friday, 13 February 2026. This exercise aims to help students respond calmly and responsibly to potential power supply disruptions, given Singapore's reliance on fuel imports. Students will subsequently reflect on their experiences through guided classroom discussions.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to engage your child/ward in sharing his/her experience and to reinforce the important message that everyone has a part to play in Total Defence. Together, we can keep our school and Singapore safe.

1.6 Chinese New Year Public Holidays

The school will be celebrating Chinese New Year on Monday, 16 February 2026. All students are encouraged to come to school dressed in traditional Chinese attire or a red top with school shorts/skirt. Students will be dismissed at 10.30am via their regular dismissal gates. Please refer to the *Chinese New Year Celebrations@YN LTP* for more information.

Tuesday, 17 February 2026, and Wednesday, 18 February 2026 are public holidays. The school will be closed on both days, and we look forward to welcoming students back to school on Thursday, 19 February 2026.

1.7 Mother Tongue Languages Fortnight

The Mother Tongue Languages Fortnight will take place from Monday, 23 February to Friday, 6 March 2026. The programme aims to promote the learning of Mother Tongue Languages in a fun and engaging manner, fostering an immersive environment for students to appreciate their languages and cultures. Hands-on activities will be conducted during class and recess time to provide authentic opportunities for students to use their Mother Tongue Language skills and deepen their understanding of their cultural roots.

Concurrently, the Primary 3 Cultural Camp is organised as part of the Mother Tongue Languages Fortnight to provide a meaningful cultural immersion experience for our P3 students. Through hands-on activities such as Chinese paper umbrella painting, bamboo scroll making, and Chinese paper kite crafting, they will enjoy a range of cultural activities that deepen their appreciation of Mother Tongue languages and heritage. The camp also develops creativity, fine motor skills, and collaboration whilst nurturing curiosity, cultural confidence, and a sense of identity through experiential learning.


