FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL

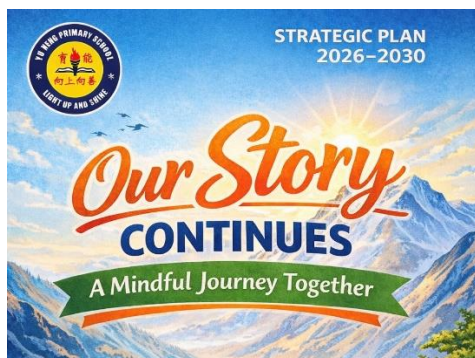
Dear Parents / Guardians,

2. SCHOOL ROUTINES

2.1 Attendance

At Yu Neng Primary, we place strong emphasis on regular and punctual school attendance. We believe that consistent attendance enables students to make optimal progress in developing healthy habits, life skills, character, and academic learning.

Parents are kindly reminded **not** to take their children out of school during term time without valid reasons, including for overseas travel. Should there be a need for leave during term time, parents are required to submit a request for a Leave of Absence (LOA) in advance to the Principal through the Form Teacher.

All absences from school must be supported by a medical certificate (MC) or a letter of excuse from parents/guardians, which should be submitted via Parents Gateway. We appreciate your kind understanding and cooperation in supporting your child's learning and development.

2.2 Health and Well-being Matters

Student Health, Well-Being and School Routines

Your child's health and well-being are of utmost importance to us. We are committed to ensuring that Yu Neng Primary remains a safe and healthy environment for all students and staff, and we seek parents' continued support in this effort. If your child is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention where necessary. For students recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, we encourage the exercise of social responsibility, such as wearing a mask and minimising interactions with large groups.

Temperature-Taking Exercise

From 2026, the temperature-taking exercise will be conducted once a year.

- Date of Exercise in 2026: **Wednesday, 1 April 2026**
- Parents are advised to ensure that your child's thermometer is in good working condition and brought to school on that day.
- If a thermometer has been misplaced, a replacement can be purchased from the school bookshop at \$5.50 per piece.

All Primary 1 students have been issued a new Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT) on Friday, 2 January. This is a one-off issuance, and the cost of any future replacements will be borne by parents.

Recess and Snack Break Arrangements

To support our students' well-being, the school will continue with cohort recess timings. In addition, students will be provided with a short snack break in class. Students are strongly encouraged to bring light and healthy snacks from home, such as sandwiches, fruits, or biscuits.

Your child will receive a consolidated and customised After-School Activities Consent Form in Term 1, Week 2. Parents are kindly requested to review the form carefully and indicate your consent for your child's participation in the various after-school activities. Please remind your child to return the signed consent form to his/her Form Teacher by the stipulated deadline.

2.3.1 Academic Support

The school will be conducting FUNDamentals, an after-school programme designed to strengthen foundational knowledge and skills **for selected Primary 5 and Primary 6 students**. The programme comprises customised and differentiated lessons, tailored to better support your child's learning needs. FUNDamentals lessons will be conducted **face-to-face in school** starting from Term 1, Week 5 (Monday, 2 February 2026). Each session will be held from 2.00 p.m. to 3.30 p.m.

2.3.2 Co-Curricular Activities (CCA)

CCA plays an integral role in the holistic development of students. Through active participation, students gain authentic opportunities to develop their character and 21st Century Competencies, while also discovering their interests and talents, helping them lead a balanced and fulfilling school life. All Primary 3 to Primary 6 students are strongly encouraged to participate in a CCA. **Primary 3 students will be informed of their CCA allocation on Monday, 12 January 2026**, and can look forward to beginning their CCA alongside their seniors.

All CCAs will be conducted face-to-face in school starting from Term 1, Week 5 (Monday, 2 February 2026). Please note that certain CCAs may have CCA-specific earlier start dates in view of upcoming competitions in the early part of the year. The respective CCA teachers-in-charge will share further details and arrangements directly with their CCA students.

3.2 Parent-Teacher Meeting

We believe that partnering with parents and guardians is a key part of our students' educational journey. We are committed to building effective home-school partnerships to nurture and support the growth of every child. Our first virtual Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) for 2026 has been scheduled for Saturday, 24 January 2026, for all levels. 3.3 P4 Museum-Based Learning (MBL) to National Gallery Singapore

The National Gallery Singapore houses a rich collection of Southeast Asian art, providing an authentic context for learning about local art as part of Primary 4 students' core art curriculum. Through this experience, students will deepen their understanding and appreciation of Singapore's history and heritage, expressed through the works of local artists.

The P4 Museum-Based Learning (MBL) experience is designed to provide both breadth and depth in learning about local art. It includes pre-, during-, and post-visit activities, allowing students to engage as both artists and audience, creating and appreciating art in a meaningful way.

Respective P4 classes are scheduled to attend their MBL on:

- Thursday, 15 January 2026
- Friday, 16 January 2026
- Thursday, 22 January 2026

Further details will be shared via Parents Gateway in a separate letter.

3.4 Primary 5 Project Work

Project Work (PW) is a multidisciplinary learning experience that allows students to think creatively and critically to apply the knowledge learnt in lessons in the real-world context to create for good. Students will also reflect on and evaluate their work processes and learning attitudes for continuous improvement. In Yu Neng, our PW takes on a blended approach where students employ the effective use of technology to hone their research skills, communicate ideas and collaborate with peers online. They would also harness the affordances of technology to engage an authentic audience in the presentation of their work confidently and motivate their audience to action in their causes.

There will be scheduled Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days for P3 to P5 during PW to provide the opportunity and experience for students to demonstrate the necessary digital literacy skills and dispositions as they work towards becoming self-directed and independent learners. On HBL Days, students of the mentioned levels are expected to stay at home to engage in planned online and offline learning activities.

Your child will also be provided with instructions on how to access their learning materials by his/her teachers. Please make home care arrangements for your child if he/she has home-based learning. Students enrolled in the school-based Student Care Centre (SCC) may attend from 1.30 p.m. on HBL days and please coordinate directly with Big Heart SCC on this.

This year, our P5 students will embark on a rice-planting journey to learn more about food sustainability. The P5 HBL Day is scheduled for **Wednesday, 11 February 2026** and more information will be shared in a separate letter. HBL information for P3 and P4 students will also be shared separately in due course.

3.5 School Health Visit

The Ministry of Health (MOH) School Health Service (SHS) conducts annual health screenings to ensure the well-being of students. Our school's SHS visits are scheduled from Monday, 26 January 2026 to Wednesday, 4 February 2026.

All P1 to P5 parents are strongly encouraged to complete the Child Lifestyle Questionnaire by Friday, 16 January 2026. **Health Booklets from P1 and P5 students should be submitted to their Form Teachers by Monday, 15 January 2026.** Please refer to the MOH letter sent via Parents Gateway by Wednesday, 31 December 2025 for more details.

4. IMPORTANT THINGS TO NOTE

4.1 School Attire & School Uniform Supplier

Students will continue to be allowed to wear either their school uniform or PE attire daily. This aims to provide greater support to all students in view of the warm weather. Do note that students are

to tuck in their shirt/t-shirt at all times. More information on the school attire can be found in our Student Handbook.

Students will be expected to wear the school uniform with their ties for the termly Celebration Day, to be held on Friday, 13 March 2026, Friday, 29 May 2026, Friday, 28 August 2026 and Thursday, 19 November 2026. Similarly for the annual class photo-taking for all levels this year, students will be required to be in their school uniform with school tie. Additionally, P1s and P6s are also to put on their full uniform with tie for the SMART Card photo-taking (see Para 3.1 above) on Friday, 9 January 2026.

4.2 School Security Measures

To ensure a safe and secure learning environment for all students and staff, the following measures apply to everyone entering or waiting on school grounds:

- All visitors must register at the security desk in the school foyer.
- Visitors with an official appointment should report to the General Office to obtain a visitor's pass.
- Parents and caregivers are not permitted to wait inside the school compound during school hours. Please wait punctually at your child's designated dismissal gate.
- Students will be dismissed via Gate 4 after CCA or other after-school activities.

4.3 Safety Messages

The school will be conducting a safety briefing on Friday, 9 January 2026 to remind all students of important safety habits and messages to keep themselves safe. We would like to seek your cooperation to work with the school in ensuring the safety of students coming to and leaving school and to inculcate good safety practices by encouraging and role-modelling for your child. This is especially important as young children may not have the skills required to use roads properly and do not always fully appreciate the dangers presented. Their small physique also makes them less visible to motorists.

We would like to reiterate the road safety policies of the school:

- a) Reduce vehicle speed and stay alert for pedestrians in the school zone.
- b) Cooperate with traffic marshals to ensure overall safety and smooth traffic flow.
- c) Let your child alight only at the **designated drop-off points**.

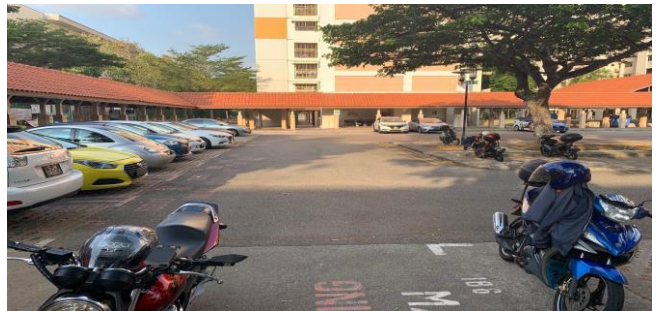
Parents who are sending their child to school by car, can either:

- i. drive into the school to alight your child between 6.30a.m. to 7.30a.m.; or
- ii. alight your child at public HDB carpark at Blk 508 which has a sheltered walkway leading to gate 4 of the school.

For the safety of your child and other road users, please do not alight your child along the road just outside our school main gates.

- d) Be advised not to violate traffic rules by driving recklessly or making illegal maneuvers such as turning into the school from the outer lane(s) of the road.
- e) Do not sound the horn indiscriminately.
- f) Let your child alight from the car on the side nearest to the kerb as quickly as possible.
- g) Reinforce correct road safety behaviour such as using pedestrian crossings and avoiding jaywalking or using a handphone while crossing. The roads outside our school can be busy during peak hours. Please remind your child to use the traffic lights near the school to get across roads.

- h) Remind your children to practise the kerb drill before crossing - "look right, look left, look right again, ensure all vehicles have stopped, raise your hand high up and cross the road briskly".
- i) If your child must cycle to school, ensure that he knows safe cycling rules and is a competent cyclist. **We strongly encourage cyclists to wear a helmet that fits properly** to protect their head from injury. They may park their bicycles at the designated lots nearest Gate 4.
- j) For the safety of everyone, enforcement action will be taken against motorists who violate traffic rules.

We thank all parents and guardians who have been role models for our children.

4.4 Fire Drill

The school will be conducting fire drills on Tuesday, 27 January 2026 and Thursday, 23 July 2026 which aim to familiarise students, school staff and vendors with emergency procedures. The safety exercises are essential in providing the experience for everyone in the school building to know the evacuation plan and to heighten awareness of personal safety in the event of a real emergency. Parents are strongly encouraged to spend time talking with your child to reinforce the above-mentioned safety messages.

4.5 Insurance for Students

All students in government and government aided schools are covered under the Ministry of Education's Group Personal Accident (MOE GPA) Insurance Plan for Students. The MOE GPA insurance is provided at no cost to parents. This insurance covers students for accidents that may occur during school hours, during school-related activities, and while students are travelling directly to and from school, subject to the policy's claim limits. We strongly recommend that students seek treatment at public healthcare institutions to ensure sufficient coverage under the MOE GPA insurance scheme. As private hospitals charge significantly higher medical costs, there may be more out-of-pocket expenses for parents/guardians as there are caps to the MOE GPA insurance. Please note that all claims are subject to the policy terms and conditions. Please refer to the attached detailed factsheet that outlines the specific coverage details, online claim procedures, and important terms and conditions.

4.6 Birthday Celebrations

The school will not accept requests from parents to celebrate their children's birthdays in school. The guideline is put in place to prevent:


- Potential food safety and allergies incidents
