2.1 Singapore and Asian Schools Math Olympiad (SASMO)

Founded in 2006, the Singapore and Asian Schools Math Olympiad (SASMO) is one of Asia's largest international Mathematics competitions. It is designed to stretch students beyond the standard school curriculum by developing higher-order thinking, deepening mathematical reasoning, and strengthening problem-solving skills.

We congratulate our students on their commendable performance and celebrate their achievements in this prestigious competition.

2.2 Asia-Pacific Mathematical Olympiad for Primary Schools

Organised annually by Hwa Chong Institution since 1990, the Asia-Pacific Mathematical Olympiad for Primary Schools is a highly regarded Mathematics competition that aims to cultivate a strong interest in Mathematics while sharpening higher-order thinking skills.

The competition presents students with challenging non-routine problems that require logical reasoning, strategic thinking, and creativity. We commend our students for their outstanding achievements and the determination they demonstrated throughout the competition.

2.3 Visual-Spatial Mathlympics

The Visual-Spatial Mathlympics, jointly organised by Learners' Connections Pte Ltd and Marshall Cavendish Education, is a competition that integrates spatial intelligence with mathematical thinking through carefully curated problem-solving tasks.

The competition aims to nurture spatially literate learners who are able to think critically about space, apply spatial reasoning effectively, and make meaningful mathematical connections. We are proud of our students for their excellent performance and commend them on their accomplishments.

2.4 National School Games (NSG) & Kin-Ball Championships

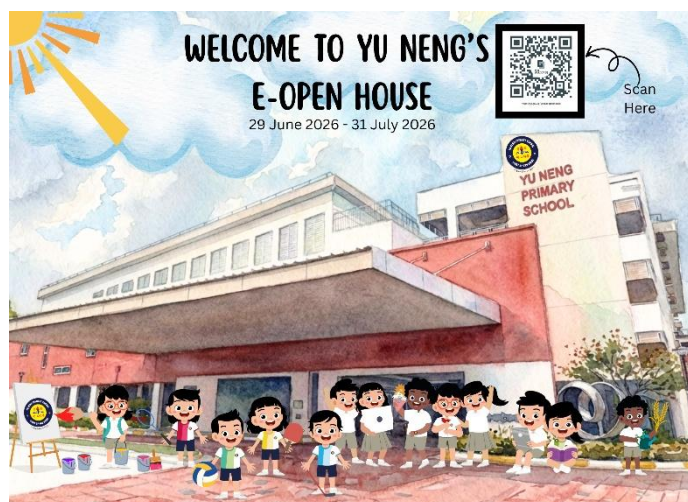

3.1 YNPS e-Open House

3.2 P6 Social Studies Learning Journey to Asian Civilisations Museum

On Monday, 29 June and Wednesday, 8 July, our Primary 6 students will embark on a Social Studies field-based learning journey to the Asian Civilisations Museum. During the visit, students will deepen their understanding of the historical and cultural connections between Singapore and the Southeast Asian region. They will also explore how these influences have shaped Singapore's multicultural identity and heritage over time. Details of the learning journey have been shared with parents via Parents Gateway.

3.3 Visit by K2 students from Preschools

On Thursday, 2 July, Yu Neng Primary School will welcome K2 students from four preschools for a meaningful school visit. Our Primary 1 students will warmly receive the young visitors into their classrooms, with selected students serving as buddies to guide them through various learning activities. In addition, our Primary 1 Ambassadors will lead the visitors on a tour of the school. This meaningful experience provides our students with an opportunity to demonstrate care, leadership and responsibility while serving as positive ambassadors for the school.

3.4 P6 Learning Journey to Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum

As part of the Science Department's efforts to enrich authentic learning experiences, our Primary 6 students will participate in a learning journey to the Lee Kong Chian Natural History Museum between Friday, 3 July and Friday, 17 July. Students will take part in the Singapore Biodiversity and Adaptation Workshop, where they will deepen their understanding of Singapore's rich biodiversity and discover how animals adapt to their environments. Through close examination of authentic animal specimens, students will investigate structural adaptations and infer behavioural adaptations, strengthening their scientific inquiry skills. Further details will be shared by the Primary 6 Science teachers during Term 3, Week 1.

3.5 FAME@YN

FAME@YN is a platform that provides students the opportunity to showcase their talents, develop confidence and express their creativity. Primary 1 to Primary 3 students are invited to audition for performances to be held during the August recess periods. Students may perform a dance, song or instrumental item aligned to this year's theme, "Our Happy Harmony."

More information can be found in the SLS assignment titled "FAME@YN 2026 2nd Edition." Students who wish to participate should submit their interest by Monday, 6 July. We look forward to celebrating the diverse talents of our students and wish all participants an enjoyable and meaningful learning experience as they prepare for the stage.

3.6 P4 Social Studies Learning Journey to Kreta Ayer

Our Primary 4 students will visit the Kreta Ayer Heritage Gallery on Tuesday, 7 July, Thursday, 9 July, and Thursday, 16 July. The learning journey aims to deepen students' understanding of Chinese heritage and culture while fostering a stronger appreciation of Singapore's multicultural society and community spirit. The consent form and details of the learning journey have been shared with parents via Parents Gateway.

3.7 Math Week

We are excited to announce our annual Math Week, which will be held from Tuesday, 7 July to Friday, 10 July. Throughout the week, students will participate in a variety of engaging curriculum-based and recess activities designed to stretch their mathematical thinking, encourage collaboration, and deepen their appreciation for the subject.

Through these hands-on learning experiences, students will apply mathematical concepts to authentic, real-world contexts, reinforcing the relevance of Mathematics in everyday life while cultivating curiosity, confidence and a lifelong love for learning. We thank you for your continued support as we nurture mathematically confident and inquisitive learners.

3.8 Student Leaders' Investiture 2026 & Prefects' Investiture 2026

At Yu Neng, we are committed to nurturing future-ready leaders grounded in strong values and a heart to serve. Through our Total Learning Experience, we provide opportunities for every student to discover their strengths, develop leadership potential, and make meaningful contributions to the school community.

Aligned with this year's theme, "Leadership Ignite", the Student Leaders' Investiture seeks to inspire our student leaders to discover their passion, purpose and drive to lead. As they embrace greater student agency, we encourage them to step forward confidently, take ownership of their responsibilities, and lead by positive example in serving others.

The Student Leaders' Investiture will be held on Friday, 10 July, in the School Hall during the morning assembly. During the ceremony, our student leaders, including the newly appointed Primary 3 Prefects and CCA Leaders, will be officially entrusted with their leadership roles. A key highlight will be the symbolic handover of responsibilities from the Primary 6 Prefect EXCO Team to the newly appointed Primary 5 Prefect EXCO Team, signifying the continuity of leadership and the shared commitment to serve with integrity and dedication.

In the afternoon, an on-site Prefects' Investiture will be held for our Primary 3 to Primary 5 Prefects and their parents. This special occasion allows families to celebrate this important milestone together while reaffirming the vital role our Prefects play in upholding school values, modelling exemplary behaviour, and living out our school motto, "Light Up and Shine."

3.9 Cultural Performance Exposure Scheme (CPES)

On Monday, 13 July, our Primary 4 Chinese Language students will participate in the Primary 4 Cultural Performance Learning Journey (CPES-LJ) to the Chinese Opera Cultural Performance Programme (文化随意门计划) at Tampines East Community Centre.

Through this enriching learning experience, students will deepen their appreciation of the Chinese language and culture by experiencing the traditional performing art of Chinese opera. They will watch a professional performance of The Monkey King Battled the Spider Spirit (《孙悟空大战蜘蛛精》), and learn about the distinctive movements, performance techniques and traditional musical instruments associated with this art form. We hope this authentic cultural experience will strengthen students' appreciation of Singapore's rich cultural heritage while enriching their learning beyond the classroom.

3.10 P3 & P4 Home-Based Learning Day (HBL)

Project Work (PW) provides students with authentic multidisciplinary learning experiences that encourage them to think creatively and critically while applying classroom knowledge to real-world contexts. Throughout the process, students also reflect on their learning, evaluate their work processes, and identify ways to improve.

At Yu Neng, Project Work adopts a blended learning approach, enabling students to leverage technology to conduct research, collaborate with their peers, communicate their ideas effectively, and present their work confidently to authentic audiences. The scheduled Home-Based Learning (HBL) Day for Primary 4 Project Work will be on Wednesday, 15 July, while the HBL Day for Primary 3 Project Work will be on Wednesday, 22 July.

These HBL Days provide valuable opportunities for students to demonstrate self-directed learning, digital literacy, and effective time management. Students are expected to remain at home and complete the planned online and offline learning activities independently. Teachers will provide clear instructions on how to access the required learning materials.

We seek parents' support in making the necessary home care arrangements for your child on these days. Students enrolled in our school-based Student Care Centre (Big Heart SCC) may attend from 1.30 p.m. onwards. Parents are kindly requested to liaise directly with the Student Care Centre regarding the necessary arrangements. More information is available in the Parents Gateway letter.

3.11 Commemoration of Racial Harmony

This year's Racial Harmony Day theme, "Singapore: Our People, Our Tapestry," celebrates the rich diversity of our nation and reminds us that the many cultural threads which make up Singapore's social fabric are strongest when woven together through mutual respect, understanding and shared responsibility.

To commemorate the occasion, the school has planned a series of meaningful activities from Monday, 20 July to Friday, 24 July, to help students deepen their appreciation of Singapore's multicultural identity and strengthen social cohesion. As part of the celebration, we warmly encourage all students to come dressed in an ethnic costume of their choice on Thursday, 23 July, together with their school shoes. Students from Primary 3 to Primary 6 who have Physical Education lessons that day should also bring along their school uniform or PE attire to change into.

3.12 P5 National Education Show

The National Education (NE) Show plays an important role in nurturing students' sense of national identity, pride and belonging. Our Primary 5 students will attend this year's NE Show on Saturday, 25 July. Further details are available in the Parents Gateway letter.

3.13 P5 Rice Appreciation Day

Following the successful harvest of the rice plants in Term 3, Week 1, our Primary 5 students will begin the threshing and milling process during Weeks 2 and 3 in preparation for Rice Appreciation Day on Monday, 27 July. During the event, students will celebrate the fruits of their labour while presenting the findings from the investigative experiments they conducted in Term 2. Their presentations will provide valuable insights into ways the rice germination process can be further enhanced in future planting cycles. The experience serves as a meaningful culmination of students' hands-on learning journey, reinforcing important values such as perseverance, responsibility and appreciation for food sustainability.

3.14 Self Directed Learning Days during PSLE Written Papers


