2.2 School Health Visit

2.3 Project Work and Home-Based Learning Days

Project Work (PW) is a multidisciplinary learning experience that allows students to think creatively and critically to apply the knowledge learnt in lessons in the real-world context. Students will reflect on and evaluate their work processes, learning attitudes and continuously work on them to improve.

In Yu Neng, our PW takes on a blended approach where students employ the effective use of technology to hone their research skills, communicate ideas and collaborate with peers online. They will also harness the affordances of technology to engage an authentic audience in the presentation of their work confidently and motivate their audience to action in their causes.

There will be scheduled Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days during PW to provide the opportunity and experience for students to demonstrate the necessary digital literacy skills and dispositions as they work towards becoming self-directed and independent learners. Primary 3 and Primary 4 students do not report to school on the day they are scheduled for home-based learning. Students enrolled in our school-based Student Care Centre (SCC) may come in from 12pm on the mentioned days. Do work with our Big Heart SCC directly.

2.4 FAME@YN

FAME@YN is a platform for students to showcase their talents and build confidence. Interested students are encouraged to perform a dance, a song or play an instrument. Due to current SMM, FAME@YN will be showcased online. Students should record themselves performing the item, ensuring that the focus of attention is properly captured, and sound is of good quality. Parents are strongly encouraged to assist your child in creating the video. Their recording should be submitted online via SLS by Sun 20 Mar 2022. Students can access the announcement and assignment on SLS which is posted on Tue 1 Mar 2022 for more information. We look forward to the lively and engaging performances by our students!

2.5.1 Start of P3 CCA

Following a successful CCA virtual Open House cum selection exercise for our Primary 3 students, our CCA sessions for the Primary 3 will commence from Mon 28 Feb 2022. We would like to thank parents for supporting your child in the selection of their CCAs. We hope that you will continue to partner us in your child's holistic development through their active participation in CCAs.

2.5.2 P3 Science Centre Learning Journey

As part of the Science Department 'Growing Minds, Growing Hearts' programme to promote sustainable living, P3 students will be going on a virtual learning journey (VLJ) to Singapore Science Centre on **Fri 25 Mar 2022, from 2pm to 3.30pm.** They will be exploring the magnificent world of plants through microscopic views of various plant parts, hands-on demonstrations, and viewing of various plant specimens.

Students will get access to the "I am a Young Botanist" online platform to earn the young scientist badge and e-certificate after the VLJ. As this is an after-school programme, consent forms will be issued via Parent's Gateway nearer to the date.

2.5.3 P3 Chess Workshop

The P3 Chess Workshop is designed as a task-based learning activity and will be conducted during curriculum hours. The objective of the workshop is to enable students to develop visual memory and build higher order thinking skills through learning and playing chess. This is because the need to consistently calculate the different patterns of move to gain an advantage over their opponents during a chess game will invoke the need to apply reasoning and thinking, a key process for cognitive and meta-cognitive growth. Concurrently, the P3 students will also acquire a deeper understanding of basic numeracy and geometric concepts such as positioning, ordinal numbers, columns, rows, and diagonals while deciding and making their chess moves.

The workshop will take place in week 10 of Term 1 i.e., **Mon 7 Mar - Fri 11 Mar 2022**. Students will learn about the rules of the game, participate in a quiz to strengthen their understanding of the rules, and compete virtually. At the end of the workshop, selected students will be invited to participate in an interclass chess competition during which the best 2 players will pit their skills during Math Week 2022.

2.6 P5 Kite Construction

The P5 students will be participating in Kite Construction programme which will take place over two Monday afternoons, 28 Mar and 4 Apr 2022 from 2pm to 4.30pm. It is designed to be an authentic real-world hands-on experiential and applied learning programme for our P5 cohort. The objective is to enable students to develop the capacity to draw upon their knowledge base and resources whenever they face new challenges. Our P5 students will discover how their knowledge about symmetry and composite figures can be applied. As the construction of the kite progresses, the students will subconsciously draw upon their visualisation, measurement, and critical thinking skills. The activity is intended to inevitably culminate into a fun-filled activity during which the P5 students will be given the opportunity to experience the joy of learning as they fly their own constructed kites during the concluding hour of the programme. Consent forms will be given out to all P5 parents via Parents Gateway.

2.7 P6 Science Explore

Our P6 students will be having the P6 Science Explore Programme on **Wed 23 Mar 2022** during curriculum hours. The programme aims to deepen students' interest in Science, promote a greater understanding of sustainability and cultivate social responsibility towards building a sustainable future. They will explore and build on their physical and life science concepts through various hands-on activities during the programme. Topics such as Electricity, Energy, Forces as well as the Environment will be covered. To encourage and enthuse P6 students to continue to explore and learn Science, they will be given a take-home kit each.

2.8 C.A.R.E. Symposium

To promote a supportive peer culture and a culture of care, the school will be organising the second edition of the C.A.R.E. Symposium on **Thu 31 Mar 2022** for appointed Class (P3 to P6) and CCA Peer Support Leaders (PSLs). C.A.R.E. stands for Caring Advocates Reflecting Empathy, and through this symposium, we strive for our PSLs to look out and provide support for their peers and one another. The theme for this year's symposium is Supportive Peer Culture, where the focus is on strengthening one's wholeness, wellness and well-being and building positive peer relations.

3. IMPORTANT THINGS TO NOTE

3.1 Road Safety

Road safety is a vital life skill for children, and it is essential that we educate our students on road safety. We would like to seek the partnership of our parents to teach and emphasize the importance of safe road crossing. Many of our students commute to school and return home on foot, and in the process have to cross busy road junctions. At times, they may be engaged in distracting activities such as texting, conversing on the phone, eating, drinking, talking in a group, and not be fully focused on the road conditions. In addition, they may also make hasty decisions to dash across small road junctions, unaware of the presence of road hazards. Our students' safety on the road cannot be taken for granted and as their significant trusted adults, we must constantly remind them to practise good road safety habits such as stopping to check traffic junctions before crossing or raising their hand while crossing the zebra crossing. Let us continue to work together for the safety of our students.

3.2 School Holidays

The March school holidays will commence from **Mon 14 Mar to Fri 18 Mar 2022**. Students do not need to attend school. School will resume on **Mon 21 Mar 2022**.
